MINISTERS OF THE WORD & MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

Thanks to everyone who attended the meetings this past week. The role of our Ministers of the Word and Ministers of Holy Communion is most important to the celebration of the Mass and other liturgies for the Faith Communities we belong to. All gathered, as the assembly, make their personal contribution to the worship we together participate in before God, as the followers of Christ. Some however assist in particular roles or ministries. So on behalf of all our congratulations we wish to acknowledge the kind assistance of those who Minister with us. As we get more comfortable with being back at Mass again be mindful of others in the pews beside you. If you wish to receive during the distribution of Holy Communion please clearly put out your hand to receive. For those who need the coeliac host, please go to the sacristy before Mass and arrangements will be made. For those who have loved ones sick or housebound it can be arranged for a Minister of Holy Communion to bring Holy Communion to them after Mass. This enables them be more connected to the faith community gathered for Sunday worship. It is best practice for the Minister and not anyone else to do this. The Ministers will take a pix with the Holy Communion from the tabernacle after the celebration of Mass has concluded. Please let us know through the Parish Office or at the sacristy if you'd request this. Also know that the priests visit those who is sick or housebound every month with Holy Communion for the First Fridays.
